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Cultivated food plants were harvested from early spring through late fall for their fruits, flowers, leaves, seeds, stems, and oil. When parched, dried, and stored, these same plant products could be utilized throughout the winter. Dried seeds served as a source for the following year's garden.

The dominant groups of cultivated plant species are cereals (wheat, barley, rye, rice, corn, sorghum, etc.), pulses, roots and tubers (potatoes, yam, etc.), fruits, and vegetables.
