Asking interview participants a series of informal questions to obtain knowledge has been a common practice among anthropologists and sociologists since the inception of their disciplines. Interviewing as Qualitative Research

Interviewers need to know more than simply how to conduct the interview itself. They should learn about the background for the study, previous work that has been done, and why the study is important. State who is sponsor of research. Interviewers need to know who they are working for.

Don't stop listening too soon - sometimes the best quotes / material come as the interview is wrapping up, when the scientist relaxes. On-camera Interviews (Christina Scott) The interviewee should be looking at you, not the camera. If the interviewee starts talking with too much jargon, stop & restart and work with them to translate what they are saying. Know your questions in advance. If possible, do a pre-interview off-camera. Talk the scientist through what you plan to ask.
